1	WHEREAS, Section 40001 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California authorizes
2	the Placer County Air Pollution Control District, to adopt and enforce Rules and Regulations to
3 4	achieve and maintain ambient air quality standards within the District; and
5	WHEREAS, Section 40702 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California requires a
6	district to adopt rules and regulations and do such acts as may be necessary or proper to execute the
7	powers and duties granted; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, Portions of the Placer County Air Pollution Control District (PCAPCD) have been
10	designated as "serious" non-attainment areas for the federal 8-hour ozone standard pursuant to the
11	Federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 (FCAA): and
12	
13	WHEREAS, The FCAA requires for non-attainment areas the submittal of VOC and NOx
14	Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) rules covering all Major Stationary Sources of
15	VOC and NOx; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined that the following prohibitory
18	rules shall be submitted to U.S. EPA for RACT SIP approval:

20	Rule 206 Incinerator Burning
21	Rule 212 Storage of Organic Liquids
22	Rule 215 Transfer of Gasoline into Tank Trucks, Trailers and Railroad
23	Tank Cars at Loading Facilities

22	WHEREAS, The Board of Director	rs of the PCAPCD has determined in the 2006 RACT SIP Update
23	Analysis that there are no Major Sta	ationary Sources of VOC in the PCAPCD in the categories of

- 1 Aerospace Coatings, Plastic Parts Coatings (Business Machines), Plastic Parts Coatings (Other).
- 2 Shipbuilding and Repair, Synthetic Organic Chemical Manufacturing Batch Plants, Synthetic
- 3 Organic Chemical Manufacturing Reactors, and Industrial Waste Water Treatment; and

- 5 WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined, reaffirming early findings, in
- 6 the 2006 RACT SIP Update Analysis that there are no Major Stationary Sources of VOC in the
- 7 District in the categories of Synthetic Organic Chemical Manufacturing Distillation, Large
- 8 Appliances, Magnet Wire, Metal Furniture, Traffic Marking, Natural Gas/Gasoline Plants,
- 9 Refineries, Bakeries, Ethylene Oxide, Fertilizer, Ink and Paint Manufacturing, Leather Tanning,
- 10 Pesticides, Pharmaceutical Products, Polyester Resin Manufacturing, Rubber Tires, and Sulfuric
- 11 Acid; and

- 13 WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined, reaffirming early findings, in
- 14 the 2006 RACT SIP Update Analysis that there are no Major Stationary Sources of NOx in the
- 15 District in the categories of Utility Boilers, Cement Kilns, Glass Treatment, Iron and Steel
- 16 Manufacturing, and Nitric Acid Manufacturing and Industrial Waste Water Treatment; and

17

- 18 WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined in the 2006 RACT SIP Update
- Analysis that there are no Major Stationary Sources of VOC or NOx in the District in a source
- 20 category for which no Control Technology Guideline has been promulgated for which the District
- does not have an adopted rule satisfying RACT requirements (i.e. all Major Sources have RACT
- 22 compliant rules adopted); and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined in the 2006 RACT SIP Update
- 2 Analysis that one (1) new prohibitory rule setting VOC RACT limits on coating of Metal Parts and
- 3 Products for existing non-Major VOC emission Sources in Placer County needs to be adopted and
- submitted for RACT SIP approval no later than January 1, 2009.

- 6 WHEREAS, the District has considered the relative cost effectiveness of the Metal Parts and
- 7 Products control measure as well as other factors, as required by Health and Safety Code Section
- 8 40922, and made reasonable efforts to determine the direct costs expected to be incurred by regulated
- 9 parties pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 40703; and

10

- 11 WHEREAS, these proceedings were held in a public hearing and were properly noticed pursuant to
- 12 Section 40725 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California; with any evidence having
- 13 been received concerning the proposed adoption of this Resolution and this Board having duly
- 14 considered such evidence; and

15

- 16 WHEREAS, the negative declaration findings and the finding of RACT control measures to be
- 17 adopted are categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14, California Administrative Code,
- 18 Section 15308, as an action by a regulatory agency for the protection of the environment.

19

- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board approves and adopts this Resolution
- 21 thereby approving the 2006 Reasonably Available Control Technology State Implementation Plan
- 22 (RACT SIP) Update Analysis Staff Report and the findings made therein, and directing staff to
- complete the specified rule adoption, negative declarations, and rule submissions to revise the State
