WEST PLACER MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL

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Wednesday, April 8, 2015

A regular meeting of the West Placer Municipal Advisory Council was held on Wednesday, April 8, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. at the Creekview Ranch School Library, Roseville, Ca.

1. Call to Order: John Hottle called the meeting to order at 7:01

2. Pledge of Allegiance: John Hottle led the pledge.
3. Approval of the Agenda: Walt Wyllie moved to approve the agenda as present. Carolyn Riolo seconded. Motion carried 3-0
4. Approval of the Minutes of March 11, 2015: Carolyn Riolo moved to approve the minutes of March 11, 2015. Walt Wyllie seconded. Motion carried 3-0.
5. Public comment: Any member of the public may address the Municipal Advisory Council on any matter that is NOT listed on the agenda. Comments will normally be limited to three (3) minutes per person at the discretion of the Chairperson.

Chuck Barsdale complimented the County for mowing the shoulder of Cook Riolo from Creekview Ranch to Vineyard for the students to walk on. A community member asked if it was possible for more parking to be made available at the south end of the new bridge (staging area) on Cook Riolo Rd. Another community member asked what was happening on Highway 65 near Twelve Bridges. (Cristina will check). A resident (Darryl) on Country Place and Cook Riolo questioned the drainage issue which floods his property (across from the fire station). Marilyn Jasper informed the MAC the Vineyard Ordinance was being revisited and while our area did not have any event centers at this time the neighbors of such centers are in agreement with the recommendations of the Planning commission of 7:30 pm noise reduction and 6 additional events. Vendors (center operations) wish the noise levels to be increased and time frame to 10:30. Fred Lopez (representing Cal-Fire union) informed the community that there are potential cuts in fire service being discussed with the County in relation to the upcoming contract. This would involve possible reduced staff, movement of the BC to Thunder Valley or North Auburn, movement of Brush 77 (engine). A resident on Dyer Lane reported that she has had 3 hear of cattle shot in the last week and expressed concern over kids coming out to Dyer Lane. Dale Harrington asked about the speed humps on Cook Riolo (need for) and much discussion centered on he speed humps and speed on Vineyard Road. Supervisor Duran stated that Director Ken Grehm from DPW would be reviewing/coming to the MAC related to both of the issues in the near future. Walt Wyllie informed the community of the opportunity to volunteer at justserve.org. and handed out flyers.

6. Supervisor Duran's Report: Supervisor Duran informed the Board that an ROP had been placed for a fairground operator. There is also a committee of 11 studying the issue of the fairgrounds and best uses. The County is currently discussing formatting rules on marijuana growing. Related to the fire service issue discussed earlier, the County is in talks with Cal-Fire and sees a need for potential change in operation related to large numbers of "service" calls rather than fire and methods of reducing expenditures..
7. Public Safety:
 - A. County Sheriff's Department: Officer Byrant spoke to the Dyer Road issue and a heavy concentration on the livestock shooting issue. He also reminded again of the need to place keep your valuables at home or with you when parking at the Regional Park as there have been several incidents in the parking lot of theft..
 - B. Cal-Fire: Fred Lopez reported that with the help of the landowner (fences and no trespassing signs) the partying and fires on Palladay Rd have decreased with the ability to write citations. Dyer (as expressed) is still a concern.
 - C. CHP: None available
8. Informational Item

Pedestrian Pathway Project on Cook Riolo Road: County staff and project representatives will present to the MAC an overview of the Pedestrian Pathway Project on Cook Riolo Road from Creekview Ranch School to Baseline Road. Presenters: Jean Hanson, Engineer, Placer County Roadways and Bridge Engineering and Jose Silva, Drake, Haglan and Assoc., .Inc.

Ms. Hanson and Mr. Silva presented an overview of the need for the pathway, a power point of the conceptual pathway and the funding of 2.1 million via federal funds. There was discussion by various community members related to fences moving, drainage, possible crosswalk at Cook Riolo and Vineyard, mitigation for trees removed. The project currently is expected to have 6-8 electric poles readjusted in placement and will being/complete in 2017. Each individual property owner affected has been and will continue to be informed of the progress and possible impact on their property.
