Fire Safety – you should have a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector. A smoke alarm should be placed in every bedroom and hallway that leads to a bedroom. You should not put one in or near the kitchen. You should keep your chimneys clean, do fire drills – have a rally location outside.

On the Cal Fire side –

The SRA fees are due. The fees do not go directly to the fire departments. The funds are used for various projects throughout the County and State. Some of the projects allow Cal Fire to add prevention staff. On 3/16/16 25 firefighters will be back on the force that will be

doing fuel breaks at Clark Tunnel Road behind Bickford Ranch. They will also be making fire roads from Camp Far West to Bell Road.

Cal Fire just finished their truck academy

Boot drive will be held this weekend (2/12 – 2/15) Donations help support the UC Davis Burn Institute.

They will be sending defensible space inspector to provide ideas to help protect your property.

There has been an increase in DUIs – 24 from 1/13/16 – 2/9/16

There were 124 motor vehicle accidents in the last year. From the 65 Bypass to I-80 accidents are up to 20 a month where there was an average of 5-10 a month

There was one fatal accident – a pedestrian was hit and killed while walking along I-80 near Rocklin Road

There were 6 motor vehicle accidents in the rural area where 2 were suspected DUIs

There will be a public safety fair at Strikes on 4/2/16

7. Action Item:

A) Proposed Medical Marijuana Ordinance

Josh Huntsinger, Ag Division, George Rosasco, Planning Division and Becky Riggins from County Executive Office provided an update on the medical marijuana ordinance. State law went into effective January 1, 2016. The Board of Supervisors on January 5, 2016 directed staff to develop an ordinance regulating medical marijuana. The County plans to have an ordinance in place by June 1, 2016.

A group was formed with staff from the Agricultural commissioner, County Executive Office, County Counsel and Planning Services met and developed a framework for the basis of the ordinance that will be presented to the Board of Supervisors at a future date.

Goals

- a) promote public health and safety

- b) reduce size of illicit market for cultivation
- c) prevent non-medical access and use by youth
- d) reduce environmental harm to water, habitat and wildlife
- e) provide clear criteria for business and patients who wish to operate responsibly
- f) develop a fair system of regulation and taxation that supports public purpose
- g) provide flexibility and authority for modification or adoption of additional measures into the regulatory process to ensure effective implementation

Accountability

- Annual permits
- Annual inspection
- Swift and certain enforcement

State and County licenses will also be required within the ordinance.

The MAC was being asked to provide their recommendations as follows:

1. Should the County have zoning and land use relations to control the location, amount and distribution of medical marijuana consistent with the State regulatory framework?

Turk Ozcan made motion that the MAC is in agreement with the proposed language of "County have zoning and land use relations to control the location, amount and distribution of medical marijuana consistent with the State regulatory framework. The motion was seconded by Lee Bastien. Motion carried 5-0

2. Should the industry bear the cost of regulation through fees and taxes?

Turk Ozcan made motion MAC was in agreement with the proposed language "The industry should bear the cost of regulation through fees and taxes." Lee Bastien seconded motion. Motion carried 5-0

3. Does the MAC support a comprehensive framework for regulation of medical marijuana including:

1. Allow and regulate outdoor cultivation
2. Allow and regulate indoor cultivation
3. Allow and regulate dispensaries

Turk Ozcan motioned the MAC was in agreement with language as written regarding the comprehensive framework for regulation of medical marijuana. Dan Cook seconded. Motion carried 5-0
